Helpful Hints

When planning and writing your story, think about:

- What other main character are you with?
- Does the ticket take you somewhere? / Does the ticket give you or get you something?
- Will you take anyone else with you / Will you share what you get?
- What could you do with the pot of gold?

Year 5 Writing checklist - try and use


- A range of openers (fronted adverbial, prepositional and sub-clause to open)
- A range of clauses for effect
- A range of, if not all 5, senses within your writing
- A range of punctuation for effect
- A variety of sentence lengths.
- Dialogue between your characters.



Checklist

- Plan your writing thoroughly using the sheets provided.
- Think about what will make your writing unique - can you include a twist or standout viewpoint?
- Use a wide range of vocabulary, punctuation and sentence structures.
- Ensure that your handwriting is neat and legible.
- Write at least one side of A4.
- Read through your work. Remember to check your spelling, punctuation and grammar and neatly correct any errors.
