Geography Objectives

The Grand Canyon

- KS2 - use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied

Investigating coasts

- KS2 - name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom, geographical regions and their identifying human and physical characteristics, key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers), and land-use patterns; and understand.
